

Previously Proposed Elements






Where?

Within Little Flower, with focus on:

- Streets near schools
- 13th St and Dequincy Ave Neighbor-ways
- High crash/problem intersections
- Red-lined areas



Indianapolis Accepted Bike Way and Green Way Network

When?

- Projects can occur on a yearly basis.
- Project timelines range from April to November 1st, unless an exception is made.



Why?

- Feedback from neighbors, businesses, and Scecina High School
 - Unsafe driving behaviors
 - Dangerous streets and intersections
 - Lack of parks
 - Poor walkability
- Crash Data
 - IMPO
 - IndyPedCrisis
- Lack of sidewalks
- Unmarked neighbor-ways
- Lack of placemaking




IMPO Incapacitating and Fatal Crash Dashboard

How?

- City of Indianapolis Community Powered Infrastructure Program
 - Assists with design
 - Provides permits
 - Provides 1:1 funding match
- Grant Funding, Donations, and the DPW's material lending library
- Volunteer-led

Project Milestones

- Feedback gathering is continuous
- Applied for \$2500 INDOH grant for daylighting
- Project is not a "sure thing" until accept/deny
- Nothing is set in stone until permits acquired
- Seeking win-wins

- Daylighting

- Safe Crossings at Dequincy/10th, Dequincy/16th, and Emerson/13th

New Proposed Elements

- 1. Speed Reductions:
 - 20MPH throughout neighborhood
 - 15MPH along 13th & Dequincy neighbor-ways
- 2. Chicanes
- 3. Through-traffic restrictions on neighbor-ways
- 4. Sharrows along neighbor-ways
- 5. Neighbor-way identification and wayfinding signage
