New / Continuing Business: 30-45 minutes

- RecycleForce: RecycleForce | Innovative Electronics Recycling invited because we are part of the Quality Life Plan, and recycling is key component which needs to include opportunities for neighborhood recycling. Rivoli Neighborhood & RecycleForce would like to propose a motion to ask the city urgently (as a Call to Action) to install a recycling area in Rivoli Neighborhood for all local neighborhoods. RecycleForce will staff the area, but it will still need electricity and security. Hours will be open M-F, 8-5pm.
 - o Motion was raised, seconded, and passed.
 - Note: RecycleForce will take on the costs and but would welcome additional funds and volunteers.
- <u>Indy Power</u> NESCO presented on "How to Access the Indy.gov Citizens Portal for Accela under Business Services." We presented at both 10am and 11:00am. Feedback was that it was well received.
 - Additional copies of the presentation are requested, as well as to have the video posted to the NESCO site.
- **INRC Round 4:** Three grants completions are pending. Nesco is finalizing the final report for INRC for 2 neighborhoods. One neighborhood has until 22Apr25 to complete their purchases for their grant.
